


While the Friends of China, Maine Facebook page can be a resource for China information, the town office is always here to expertly answer your questions. I encourage you to join our interactive communications system TextMyGov. You can ask questions and report issues. To join Text "Hi" to 207-489-8383. Another fantastic aspect of TextMyGov is the alert system. If you want emergency, event, meeting and general town notifications, text **CHINAEMERGENCY** to 91896, **CHINAFUN** to 91896, **CHINAMEETINGS** to 91896 and **CHINANOTIFYME** to 91896 to receive important China alerts. If you need help setting these notifications up, please stop by the town office and the clerks will help you. If you sign up for **all four** notifications, you will be entered into a drawing for a Hannaford gift card. Drawings will be held on February 1st and March 1st for qualified entries.

China's public works employees are amazing. They are extremely thoughtful, considerate, and dedicated to ensuring the safety of the traveling public year-round. I'm not sure how many residents realize the long days and nights these employees put in each week. This time of year, they spend countless additional hours away from their family and friends and basically give up their lives during the winter to be available at a moment's notice. Deputy Stefanizzi wants to remind residents to not leave mail in your mailbox. There have been many instances in the county of mail being removed and checks forged. Also, credit card offers and other mail can be used in not so appropriate ways. Also, instead of placing outgoing mail in your mailbox with your flag up which easily catches the attention of criminals, it is suggested to take your mail to the secure mailbox at the post office.

Property owners, do you want to save some money on your tax bill?

If you are a long-time resident you probably already have your exemptions, but it doesn't hurt to double check by reviewing your tax bill. The applications are available on our website, at our office or at Maine.gov. The filing deadline for the upcoming tax year is **April 1, 2024.**

Some of the exemptions (and a summary of qualifications) that may be available to you:

- * Homestead Exemption You must have owned a home in Maine for the past 12 continuous months as of April 1st, it must be your primary place of residence and you must be a Maine resident.
- * Veteran/Veteran Widow Exemption You must be at least 62 and have served during an accepted war period or be 100% disabled or be the widow of a qualifying Veteran.
- **Blind Exemption** You must have been determined to be blind by a doctor.
- **Renewable Energy Equipment Exemption** Solar installation.

Once you have applied you do not need to reapply.

The Town of China is offering an E911 sign displaying your house number. Who is funding this, you ask? The project was approved by voters at the June 14, 2022 Election, Article 31, to use up to \$38,000 of ARPA funds to purchase the signs for China residents. Residents must complete an order form. Forms are available at the town office and online at www.china.govoffice.com. One sign per residence. Once the funding is exhausted, the project ends so please order soon. Orders will be combined to create bulk orders for cost reduction therefore it may take serval weeks to receive the sign. Installation of the sign is the property owner's responsibility. You will be notified when your sign is available to be picked up at the China Town Office during normal business hours. Any questions please contact the office at 207-445-2014 X3.

Effective October 1, 2023, the Maine Department of Health and Human Services has expanded eligibility for MaineCare for children and young adults under 21 in Maine to include family incomes up to 300% of the federal poverty level. That translates to an annual salary of about \$59,000 for a family of two and \$90,000 for a family of four. Additionally, the Department eliminated most premiums for children's coverage, effective March 1, 2023.
